Information and Suggested Procedure for Completing this Application.

- a. **Your application package should include; the completed form, your final grade transcript, letter of acceptance or class schedule, résumé of yourself** (*answering questions 1 to 8 on page 1*) **and a color photograph of yourself.**
- b. Fill in all the blank spaces on the application form; indicate if *not applicable* to your circumstances. **Your Social Insurance Number is required by Revenue Canada for income tax purposes.**
- c. It is essential that you include your final grade transcript (of last school attended) and the letter of acceptance to the school or faculty you will be attending or information confirming your scheduled classes. Photocopies are acceptable.
- d. If you are the recipient of a scholarship the following information may be published; your name, home town, photo, institution you will be attending and career choice. All other information will be kept confidential. It is important that you include a color photograph of yourself, suitable for reproduction; this may be used in our District and International magazines and will be posted on our website if you are a scholarship recipient. It should be a head and shoulders shot of only you no smaller than 2.5 x 3 inches and on photographic paper (please do not staple), or if digital 750x1050 pixels. Photographs will not be returned.
- e. In the section entitled "*Attach a résumé of yourself answering the following*" it is very important that you answer all eight of the requests. Answer giving complete details to all questions, however we ask that you limit your *résumé* to **two-thousand (2000) words**, excluding a table for your budget which must include BOTH **income** and **expenses**. The information that you provide is what the '*selection committee*' bases their decisions on.
- f. Each request and question carries a numerical value so it is vital that you answer all requests/questions to ensure that you will receive the highest marks possible in your bid to receive a scholarship.
- g. Answering the questions in point form, i.e. 1 to 8, clarifies your answer for the '*selection committee*'.
- h. **The deadline for submissions is August 31st.** The SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA Award Director (see address on page 2) must receive applications for post-secondary scholarships by that date.
- i. Only Canadian residents who will be pursuing their **first undergraduate degree or diploma are eligible** for a SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA Scholarship or Bursary, the student must be registered in a Canadian institution.
- j. Generally, approximately twelve scholarships of \$800.00 each are granted annually. Contact the Foundation Award Director for more details.
- k. A student may receive a maximum of three scholarships or bursaries from the SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA.
- l. If you have applied for a SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA scholarship in the past and have not been awarded the maximum number (as in k. above), you are welcome to apply again.
- m. All applicants will be notified as to their standing in the competition, generally in October. If you receive a scholarship, the Board of Directors would appreciate an acknowledgment of your receipt of it.
- n. These scholarships are made possible by donations received mainly from the Norwegian communities in Alberta, British Columbia and Saskatchewan.
